Key Vocabulary

Key words	Definition
Phonics	A way of teaching children how to read and write using sounds.
Phoneme	The smallest unit of sound. e.g. s, a, t
Grapheme	The letters that represent a sound.
Digraph	Two letters that make one sound. e.g. ai (rain)
Tri-graph	Three letters that make one sound. e.g. ear (hear)
Odd number	A number that cannot be shared equally between 2 groups.
Even number	A number that can be shared equally between 2 groups.
Weaving	The action of forming fabric by interlacing materials.
Recycle	Taking a material like a plastic bottle or a can and putting it through a process so the material can be used again.

Topics this term!

In our Science lessons the children will be learning about seasonal changes and the weather. Later on they will discover different plants and how they grow!

In Art our lessons will focus on the skills of drawing. Children will develop drawing skills using pencils, charcoal and other mediums.

For our DT lessons this half term the children will develop their cutting and weaving skills whilst making sliders for a moving picture.

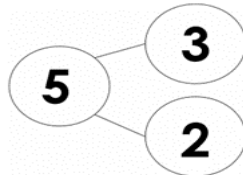

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Mathematics



In maths this half term we will be learning about:

- Positional language
- Subitising numbers

- Solving word problems numbers to 10
- Equality and balance numbers to 10

- The Storm Whale - by Benji Davis

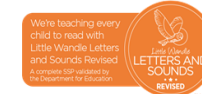
Key Vocabulary

- Capital letters
- Finger spaces
- Full stops

- Compound word - two or more words that have been grouped together to create a new word
- Root words - a complete word that you can't break down any further.
